

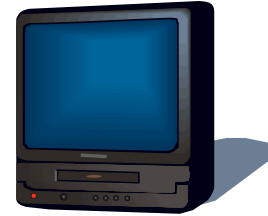
# Electronics Disposal

---

Effective January 1, 2012, the Illinois Electronic Products Recycling Act landfill ban will **prohibit the following items from being disposed of in regular trash collection:**



**Televisions**  
**Monitors**  
**Printers**  
**Computers (including tablet or laptop computers)**  
**Electronic Keyboards**  
**Facsimile Machines**  
**Videocassette Recorders**  
**Portable Digital Music Players**  
**Digital Video Disc Players**  
**Video Game Consoles**  
**Small Scale Servers**  
**Scanners**  
**Electronic Mice**  
**Digital Converter Boxes**  
**Cable Receivers**  
**Satellite Receivers**  
**Digital Video Disc Recorders**



Residents must dispose of these prohibited items by taking the items to a designated residential electronics collection drop off site in Lake County.

Other recycling or reuse options that may be available include:

**The Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO) also provides the following year round locations for residents to drop off items at no charge. *These locations are for electronics only, NO household chemical waste will be accepted.***

Second Tuesday of every other month

- From May 1, 2012 through September 28, 2012, the Village of Mundelein operates an Electronics Recycling Program at the Public Works Facility at 440 E. Crystal, Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.
- Contact Groot (566-5159) to arrange for pick-up of electronics (fee charged)
- Donation of good working equipment to charitable organizations
- Utilizing a home collection service
- Bringing them to a retail store that accepts electronics for recycling.
