MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Kenneth H. Kessler

I am pleased to report that we are starting to see some positive indications that our local economy is improving. Granted we have been hit hard with foreclosures and falling assessments, but the following are positive signs that at least locally there is an economic upturn.

New housing permits have held steady. So far this year, the Building Department has approved 36 new housing starts. These were driven mostly by new home construction in the Tall Grass Ridge and Grand Dominion subdivisions. This is not a building “boom”, but it is evidence that there is good demand for new homes in Mundelein. Interestingly, the Affordable Housing Corporation of Lake County, a non-profit organization that buys and rehabs foreclosed properties, reports that it finds that homes sell very well in Mundelein. After rehabbing and selling 10 homes in Mundelein over the last 2 years, AHC is looking for more projects here.

Other indicators that support a positive economic outlook include: 1) The announcement by Menard’s that it will purchase a portion of the Rubloff property on Route 60/83 across from the Mundelein Crossings Plaza to build a new store; 2) Walmart’s decision to purchase most of the Oak Creek Plaza shopping center for the construction of a Super

Walmart. When Menards leaves, everything but the Hobby Lobby building and out-lots will be torn down to make way for the Walmart store; 3) The Pita Inn’s decision to purchase and remodel the vacant Krispy Kreme building at Oak Creek Plaza; 4) The \$2.5 million façade improvement taking place at the Townline Shopping Center; 5) The



Village and Weston Solutions partnership to redevelop the west side of the railroad tracks downtown for a Village Hall and corporate office space. New road and utility installation in this area will begin in October and 6) The renewal of discussions to build Cardinal Square building number two.

Finalizing development agreements and completing construction is a long process. The projects listed here will take time to complete. The good news is that we have significant projects in planning and development that will have a positive impact on the economy in the years ahead.

Zoning Ordinance Update

The Village Board will adopt a new Village Zoning Ordinance soon. The current ordinance was adopted in the 1960s. It needed a complete overall to conform with modern times. The new ordinance is more user-friendly and instructive. Changes in the new ordinance include 1) New zoning districts such as Downtown, Mixed-Use Lakefront, and Mixed-Use Industrial; 2) “General Use” categories rather than specific “Permitted” and “Special Uses” (although some uses are still specified); 3) Encouragement of sustainable and green energy practices; 4) Adjustments to lot size, bulk, and density; and 5) Use of diagrams and charts to more clearly explain the regulations. The objective of the new ordinance is to minimize nonconforming uses and to facilitate development that is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan, Downtown Master Redevelopment Implementation Plan, and Transit Oriented Development Plan.



Upcoming Elections

The next general election for all levels of government will be November 6, 2012. The first day to request a ballot by mail is September 27th. Voter registration closes October 9th and reopens on November 8th. Early voting will take place between October 22nd and November 3rd.

The next consolidated election for local government officials will be held on April 9, 2013. Municipal, school, township and special service district officials will be elected at that time. The first day to circulate nomination papers for the April 2013 election is September 25, 2012. The nomination papers may be filed between December 17 and December 24, 2012.

Local elected officials may be less prominent than state and national candidates, but they play a crucial role in our daily life. Dedicated, objective leaders are always needed for these governing bodies. Candidates must be citizens, 18 years of age or older, a resident of the district for which they are seeking office, and a registered voter. Nomination packets are obtained directly from the unit of government for which a petitioner is seeking election.

Voter Registration

Residents who are new to Lake County, moved to a new address in Lake County, turned 18 on or before the next election day, or have changed names, must register with their local deputy registrars by Tuesday, October 9th in order to vote in the November election. New registrants must be U.S. citizens, a minimum of 18 years of age on or before the election, a resident of the precinct for 30 days immediately prior to Election Day, and must provide two forms of valid identification.

Registration is available at the Lake County Clerk's office in Waukegan and the Mundelein Village Hall, municipal townships and library facilities. To find the nearest registration location, visit the County Clerk's website under "Official Places of Voter Registration" or call the Clerk's Office at 847-377-2410.



Residents can now take advantage of a new bus service. The Pace Call-n-Ride Program is a reservation-based, curb-to-curb service open to the general public within a designated area. Residents who wish to ride call 224-735-8678 (weekdays between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 6:15 p.m.) to make a reservation.

The Call-n-Ride service will take patrons anywhere within the area bounded by Milwaukee Ave., Route 45/83, Route 60, East Hawley Street and the Metra North Central Service and EJ & E Railroads. Maps are available at Vernon Hills or on-line. Service is also provided to the Metra North Central Mundelein and Vernon Hills train stations. The small, wheelchair-accessible bus is recognizable by the Call-n-Ride logo. Trip reservations are made by phone on a first come, first served basis.

Transfers to and from Routes 272 and 572 are free, but you must ask the driver for a transfer card. Regularly scheduled transfers are also available at Westfield Hawthorn Mall. Visit www.pacebus.com for more information.

Community Emergency Response Team

Following a disaster, first responders who provide fire and medical services have to prioritize their resources. They can use help, which is frequently provided by Community Emergency Response Teams - CERTS.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency promotes CERTs as a means to better connect first responders to the community they serve.

The CERT program provides disaster preparedness education training in disaster response skills, such as fire safety, search and rescue, team organization, and medical operations. Trained CERT members assist when professional responders are not immediately available. CERT members also take an active role in emergency preparedness planning. The Mundelein CERT program currently has 32 members. The team meets semi-monthly for refresher training and drills, and also supports Village-sponsored events.

The Mundelein CERT program is offering a 20-hour training program on October 12 (6 – 10 PM), October 13 (8 AM – 4 PM) and October 14 (8 AM – 4 PM) at Mundelein Fire Station 1, 1000 N. Midlothian Road. Enrollment and materials are free and open to anyone 18 years of age or older, or those 16 and 17 years old with a signed permission slip and waiver from their parents. Upon completion of the course, participants will be invited to join the Mundelein CERT team, although doing so is not a requirement. Applications may be obtained at the Fire Station (847-949-3260) or by emailing cert@mundelein.org. Applications must be returned by October 1, 2012.

Autism Training Key in Emergency Response

Earlier this year, the Office of the State Fire Marshal, in partnership with the Illinois Fire Service Institute, introduced a new training program for firefighters and emergency medical services personnel to better protect individuals with autism and related disorders. The Mundelein Fire Department participated in the program entitled, "Autism Spectrum and Similar Disorders in Emergency Situations", through the Fire Service Institute based at the University of Illinois.

The program provided an awareness-level introduction to firefighters and emergency medical personnel who may encounter autistic individuals in both low stress and high stress/high risk situations.

The Mundelein Fire Department was the first department in the state to complete this training with all of its personnel. Shortly after the training, Mundelein Fire personnel responded to a serious accident that involved an autistic child. They applied their training and as a result, this call was handled with extreme professionalism to the benefit of the patient. The responding personnel (Battalion Chief Matt Carey, Firefighter/Paramedic David Myers, Michael Dippel, Marek Kokosinski and Steven Zurek) were recognized by Northwestern Lake Forest Hospital as recipients in their "A Cut Above" recognition program for their excellent response in a pre-hospital care situation.

ISO EVALUATION

In August, the Mundelein Fire Department was evaluated by the Insurance Services Office, Inc. (ISO). ISO is the principle provider of insurance underwriting, rating, and statistical information to the insurance industry. The evaluation included review of training, inspections, staffing, apparatus, equipment, station locations, dispatch service and a comprehensive review of the Village's water system. Currently Mundelein's rated three, with one being the best and nine being the lowest. Results from this evaluation should be available in the next three to five months.

NEW TECHNOLOGY

In July, a new ambulance was put into service replacing a 1998 ambulance. The department also recently acquired a new set of Rescue Struts which are essential in stabilizing vehicles after serious accidents as well as other types of incidents.

A new video conferencing system will soon be installed at both Fire Stations as part of a joint federal grant received with other communities. This application of technology is an effective way to enhance fire and emergency medical training, reduce vehicle movements and keep fuel costs down. In the coming months, the department will move to a new electronic patient medical reporting system through Advocate Condell Hospital. This system will enhance the ability to quickly access patient records.

Police Department

Residents Can Access Local Crime Data

The Mundelein Police Department recognizes the importance of providing the community with information regarding crime trends. Residents can now gain access to neighborhood-level crime incident data in near real time at www.crimereports.com. Mundelein Police Chief Raymond Rose emphasized that, "An informed public is a safer public."

The free crime data is available through www.CrimeReports.com or through the CrimeReports iPhone application which is available as a free download from the iTunes online store. Residents can sign up for the free customizable email updates so they can monitor crime in their neighborhood.

More than a thousand other law enforcement agencies of all sizes across the country are sharing their crime information with citizens through the national crime map which covers nearly 30% of the U.S. population. Residents can access their local crime map and sign up for daily, weekly, or monthly email crime updates to keep informed about local crime.



Parent Academy

The Mundelein Police Department will be hosting a Parent Police Academy from 6:30 p.m. - 8:30 p.m. on Wednesday nights from October 3rd through October 24, 2012. This free four week academy is designed for parents of teenagers ages 13 and up. Class size is limited to 30 participants. Alumni Academy Association Fundraiser

The Mundelein Police Academy Alumni Association will be holding its fourth annual fundraiser on Friday, November 30th from 5:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. at the Mundelein Police Department, 221 N. Lake Street. This event includes a spaghetti dinner and silent auction immediately following the Village's Annual Tree Lighting held at Kracklauer Park. Tickets are \$7 for adults, \$5 for children (5-12 years of age) and children 4 and under are free. Tickets can be purchased at the door or in advance in at the Police Department.

The Alumni Association assists the Police Department with many events throughout the year and has donated equipment such as portable breath testers for the department's use and donated money to support the Shop with a Cop program.

The Police Department also conducts a Senior Citizen Academy and a regular Citizen Police Academy at various times during the year. These academies enable residents to gain a better understanding of police activities. Watch the Village website or check future newsletters for upcoming academies.

Scam Alert!

Counterfeit check scams can take many forms and thieves are constantly changing them.

If you receive a check in the mail from a person or company you do not know, do not cash the check. It may be a way for thieves to get your bank account information.

A more common scam is when an individual offers an item for sale via the internet and is contacted by a prospective buyer and they agree upon a price. The buyer sends a check to the seller for more than is agreed and asks the seller to wire the extra amount to the buyer. The seller deposits the check in his/her personal account, sends the extra amount to the buyer, and later learns the check is counterfeit, sometimes after having shipped the sold item to the fraudulent buyer losing out both on the item and their money.

Building Department

RENTAL REGISTRATION ORDINANCE

On August 27th, the Village Board approved changes to the Rental Registration Ordinance, changing the date payments are due and late fee penalties. Currently, payments received after January 15th incur a late fee penalty of \$70. That date has now been moved to January 31st and the late fee penalties have been restructured. Payments received after January 31st but before March 1st will incur a \$30 late fee. Payments received on or after March 1st and before April 1st will incur a \$50 late fee, and payments after April 1st will be assessed with a \$70 late fee.

The requirement to attend the Crime Free Training Seminar every three years has been removed. However, landlords may be required to take the training again in either a four or eight hour session if the properties they own or manage become a nuisance. The criteria for this determination are listed in the revised Ordinance which is available on the Village website and are available from the Building Department. The Rental Registration Ordinance is an important tool for effective oversight of rental properties and communications with landlords, in order to limit nuisances, enforce building codes and address complaints.

Water Payments

There are two drop boxes located at the Village Hall to make it more convenient for residents to make payments before and after business hours. When using these drop boxes please remember to verify that your check is signed, your account number is included on your check and a copy of your payment stub is provided. Payments deposited in the drop box after 5:00 p.m. on the date they are due will be assessed a late fee.

Avoid the drop boxes altogether and never have a late fee by using the Main Line Pay option, an electronic bill payment method whereby you authorize the Village to automatically debit your water payment from your bank account. To sign up for this program, complete the form at the Village Hall or download the form from the Village's website.

Annual Tree Lighting

Municipal Aggregation - More Details

Residential and small business electrical customers who did not opt-out of the program, or who had not already switched to an alternate energy supplier, started receiving the lower municipal aggregation rate from First Energy Solutions in August. The lower rate of 4.77¢ per kilowatt hour will be reflected in the September bill.

The definition of a small business, as established under the State law, is only businesses that consume 15,000 kilowatts of power or less per year. This is a very low amount of consumption, only slightly greater than the average residential user. The chances are that most small businesses were not automatically included in the municipal aggregation program. In order to receive a lower electrical rate than the ComEd rate, a small business with an annual electrical consumption greater than 15,000 kWh must enroll with an alternate energy supplier. Rates vary between suppliers.

Upon purchase of a home it is the obligation of the new home owner to enroll with First Energy Solutions. The electric company that was supplying the home under the previous owner will not be continued. The supplier will automatically be switched to Com Ed unless the new customer chooses a new supplier. The \$.0477 municipal aggregation rate is only available from First Energy Solutions. Call 866-636-3749.

In September the ComEd energy rate increased from 6.123¢ to 7.511¢. When the transmission and purchased electricity adjustment charges are added in, the new effective ComEd rate from October 2012 through May 2013 will be 8.82¢ per kwh. The municipal aggregation rate from First Energy Solutions will remain 4.77¢ per kwh until August 2014, a 46% savings to your power costs. Save-a-Star Drug Disposal

Save-a-Star is a program to dispose of prescription and over-the-counter drugs and medications in an environmentally safe way, but most importantly, to keep drugs out of the hands of young children and anyone who would use them improperly. Discontinued, expired and unused medications in our homes should be disposed of responsibly. Each year 700,000 emergency room visits are attributed to prescription drug overdoses. Because chemicals and compounds react with each other, taking certain medications together can prove deadly. An estimated 48 million people over the age of 12 have used prescription drugs for non-medical reasons in their lifetime.

The Save-a-Star collection box is located in the first floor of the Police Department at 221 N. Lake Street. Items may be dropped off 24 hours a day. The medications are then be taken to a disposal facility for incineration.

Accepted Items: Prescription medications, controlled substances, over-the-counter medications, medication samples, pet medications, vitamins, supplements, ointments, lotions, creams, and oils, homeopathic remedies. Liquid medication must be in leak-proof containers.

Pharmaceutical Disposal



Every day products like shampoo, toothpaste, sunscreen, and cosmetics contain certain contaminants that our wastewater treatment plants are not able to remove from the effluent discharge. In addition to these products, small amounts of prescription and over-the-counter drugs also make their way into water.

Wastewater treatment plants do not treat the wastewater for these types of contaminants, focusing more on bacteria and other elemental contaminants. While there is no evidence that they pose a risk to human health, studies have shown trace amounts pose a significant risk to the habitat of aquatic wildlife. It's important to control what we put into the water system. Here are helpful tips for the disposal of unused pharmaceuticals:

- ▶ Follow product recommendations for use and disposal;
- ▶ Decrease use when possible;
- ▶ Keep water clean by not flushing unused medication down the toilet;
- ▶ Drop off pharmaceuticals at the Mundelein Police Department's collection box (first floor).

Controlling what goes down the drain is the easiest and most effective way to protect the environment. Questions, contact the Wastewater Treatment Division at 847-949-3275.

Leaf Collection

Ash Tree Reduction Program

In response to the recent infestation of the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB), the Village is taking steps toward preparing for and managing the impact. Public Works will assess the health of ash trees in the Village right-of-way and marking impacted ash trees for removal. Once removed, the tree will be replaced at a later date with a disease resistant, salt tolerant variety. Residents will be informed prior to removal and be given a list of potential tree varieties to choose from.

Recycle First, Trash Last

The Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO) has launched a new recycling education campaign, "Recycle First. Trash Last". The program changes the way we think about recycling by making the priority recycling first, and then (ideally) pulling trash out of the recycling. Making recycling a proactive part of people's everyday habits.



SWALCO will be spreading this message throughout the county to ensure people are reminded to recycle first. If every household in the county recycles just one extra aluminum can each week, it would be equivalent of taking 720 cars off the road per year. Rehab Program

The Affordable Housing Commission of Lake County (AHC) works with eligible homeowners that need to make improvement and repairs to their home. AHC offers special financing for Lake County homeowners whose household income does not exceed program guidelines. Financing rates are based on personal circumstances. Low-interest fixed loans and 0% interest loans are available. Examples of work that is eligible include repairs to electrical, heating, plumbing, roofs, windows, and cabinets; kitchen and bathroom improvements; water and sewer repairs; handicapped accessibility installations; and, removal of lead-based paints. Call AHC at 847-263-7478 for more information and to schedule an appointment. AHC employs a Rehab Specialist to oversee the rehab process and provide technical assistance from property assessment, obtaining bids, selecting reputable contractors, overseeing construction and conducting inspections.



The Affordable Housing Commission has rehabbed approximately 10 homes in the Village in the last 3 years through the Federally funded Neighborhood Stabilization Program designed to rescue and repair homes that are in foreclosure. The program has been very successful at salvaging and returning to the tax rolls, homes that would otherwise have become problem properties. The home rehab program is designed to help lower income homeowners make necessary home improvements that will maintain the value of the property.

Video Gaming Authorized

On September 10th the Village Board authorized the preparation of an ordinance approving video gaming in Mundelein. The Video Gaming question had been before the Board on two other occasions. With announcement by the Illinois Gaming Board (IGB) that the installation of gaming terminals will start soon, the Board reconsidered the question. State law requires action by local governments to approve or disapprove video gaming in their jurisdiction. Video gaming is only permitted in licensed liquor establishments that serve alcohol on the premises or at truck stops, fraternal or veterans facilities. State revenue from video gaming will fund capital improvement projects throughout the State. Local revenue is highly variable depending on the number of video terminals that are installed. A licensed establishment is limited to a maximum of five terminals.

E-Pay Now Available

On-line options for payment of your water/sewer bills, will be effective October 1st. Customers will be able to pay their bi-monthly water/sewer bill, set up recurring payments and view their account transaction history on the Village's website www.mundelein.org. Payment options include credit cards, debit cards, and electronic checks. A 4-digit PIN printed on the face of your water bill is required to register for online payments.
