Local Businesses Play Key Role in Construction, Opening of New Village Hall

In just one year, the heart of Downtown Mundelein has been updated with the opening of the new Village Hall. The new 32,000 square foot building is located at 300 Plaza Circle in Downtown Mundelein adjacent to the Metra Train station. Direct entrance to the Village Hall is from the east off of Plaza Circle. The Village Hall also is accessible from Hawley and Division streets.

Mundelein's new Village Hall is part of a 5-lot subdivision centered around a circular plaza. The other lots are contemplated for mixed-use office, retail, and residential development.

"After more than 80 years in the same facility, the new Village Hall stands as a strong statement of progress for Mundelein. In order to attract new businesses, families, shopping and dining we needed a structure that better communicates Mundelein's promise and fine attributes," explained Steve Lentz, Mayor.

For the project, the Village partnered with Weston Solutions—a nationally renowned environmental engineering company. The new Village Hall is a LEED certified building designed to reduce energy consumption and pollution. Throughout construction

of the new building, the team always considered the use of local vendors first before seeking services outside of Mundelein.

"The use of local vendors is always a discussion point any time staff needs to purchase commodities or services and the Village is committed to using local vendors whenever feasible. In fact, with the construction of the Village Hall, we first sought out local contractors and suppliers resulting in local vendor contracts totaling more than \$800,000," explained John Lobaito, Village Administrator.

"The Village staff is committed to provide opportunities for local businesses to compete for the business when purchasing commodities or services whenever possible. However, we also want to remain fiscally responsible to the taxpayers by selecting the lowest priced vendor provided all other factors in the decision-making process are equal. The ongoing challenge is to balance support for local businesses while maintaining our fiduciary responsibility in spending the taxpayers' money wisely," Lobaito said.

Mundelein Fire Department's New Automated CPR Device Offers Residents Most Advanced Medical Treatment



The Mundelein Fire Department recently purchased two non-invasive state of the art cardiac support pumps to enhance the medical capabilities of the Fire Department. The department's new AutoPulse is an automated, portable, battery-powered cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) device created by Revivant and manufactured by ZOLL Medical Corporation. Zoll Medical Corporation supplies the cardiac monitor/defibrillator to the Fire Department, and these two devices are capable of interacting and communicating with each other. The cost of the Autopulse is \$15,700 per unit and two were included in Mundelein's current budget.

The Autopulse is a chest compression device composed of a constricting band (LifeBand) and half backboard that is intended to be used as an adjunct during CPR by the department paramedics. "Perfect CPR is almost impossible to achieve by even trained individuals. The actual process of CPR is physically demanding and tiresome, and it often requires several individuals to relieve each other due to fatigue. The AutoPulse helps solve some of the problems, and frees up paramedics to perform other critical life-saving tasks such as starting an IV, administering medication, ventilating, or intubating," explains Tim Sashko, Mundelein Fire Chief.

"The AutoPulse delivers excellent, consistent blood flow during all patient movement operations—even when paramedics are going down stairs, moving the patient to and from the ambulance, or navigating traffic at highway speeds," he adds.

According to Zoll Medical Corporation, the AutoPulse measures chest size and resistance before it delivers the unique combination of thoracic and cardiac chest compressions. The compression depth and force varies per patient. The patient's head, shoulders and upper back lay upon the base unit, with the controls for the AutoPulse beside the patient's left ear. The LifeBand is an adjustable strap that covers the entire rib cage. When the patient is strapped in and the start button is pressed, the LifeBand pulls tight around the chest, determines the patient's chest size and resistance, and proceeds to rhythmically constrict the entire rib cage, pumping the heart at a rate of 80 compressions per minute. The LifeBand is disposable and designed to be used on a single patient for sanitary reasons.




Mundelein Introduces Pay By Phone Option at Metra Lot

The Village of Mundelein recently launched a new mobile payment parking service at its METRA parking lot. In a partnership with PassportParking and Chicago area-based Total Parking Solutions, the new service provides parking customers with the ability to pay for parking from their mobile phone.

“Paying by mobile phone provides drivers with a whole new level of convenience and flexibility when it comes to paying for parking,” said Village Administrator, John Lobaito. “With Passport Mobile Pay, customers parking at our METRA lot can now pay from the comfort of their vehicle or even on the train.”

To utilize the new service, smart phone users must first download the PassportParking app for iOS or Android devices or register online at <http://m.ppprk.com>. Customers also can register by calling the local phone number 847-380-4332.

Once registered, drivers have the option to pay using the PassportParking app, mobile website, or by calling the local toll free number. To pay, drivers simply enter the zone and space number listed on signage and then select how long they wish to stay. Both the mobile app and mobile website allow drivers to extend their parking session to the maximum time allowed, add or update payment card details, as well as manage notification and receipt options.



Curious about the life of a firefighter? The Mundelein Fire Department will be hosting a Citizens Fire Academy this fall from September 3 –October 29 each Wednesday evening from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. at Station One located at 1000 N Midlothian Road.

The Citizens Fire Academy will have both classroom and hands-on instruction on many subjects including:

- History and Department Structure
- Car Extrication "Jaws of Life"
- Emergency Medical Service
- SCBA/Air Packs
- Hose Streams/Engine Operations
- Hook and Ladder Operations
- Fire Prevention Bureau
- Communication/Incident Command

"The Citizen Fire Academy is a program designed to give participants a working knowledge of the Mundelein Fire Department. The program consists of classroom instruction/discussions, with a primary focus on hands-on exercises that may include a variety of physical activities including but not limited to standing, climbing, lifting, bending, crawling, etc. It is designed to foster an understanding of the broad spectrum of knowledge, training and skills that are necessary to be a member of the Mundelein Fire Department as a firefighter/paramedic," explains Tim Sashko, Mundelein Fire Chief.

Third Annual Latino Police Academy Offered

The Mundelein Police Department will be hosting its third annual Citizen's Police Academy for Latino residents. The Latino Citizens' Police Academy is the first of its kind in Lake County. The Latino Citizens' Police Academy is scheduled to take place every Thursday between 7 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. commencing on September 18, 2014 and ending on November 20, 2014.

The program will not only consist of explaining and demonstrating the various aspects related to the police profession, but will also include other educational topics relating to the ever changing laws as they pertain to the immigrant population.

Mundelein Electronics Drop-Off

The electronics drop-off collection at the Mundelein Public Works Facility, 440 East Crystal Street ends September 30 for the season. It will reopen again in the Spring. The drop-off is open on workdays from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. After September 30 electronic items must be taken to one of the areas year-round collection sites, or a special collection event. For more information on year-round collection sites visit www.swalco.org.

Leaf Collection Program Begins in October

The annual fall leaf collection program begins the week of October 20 and ends the week of December 5. In order to assure collection by December 5, leaves must be at the curb ready for collection by November 30. Leaves should be raked to the curb or the edge of the street, not into the street or over storm water inlets. If possible leaf piles should be a maximum of 5 feet wide. If the leaf piles are larger, the vacuum will not reach and the leaf pile will have to be raked closer. Parked cars should be at least 30' away from the leaf pile. Sticks and tree branches must be removed, they clog the hose and slow collection. On a daily basis Groot staff will report to the Village the number of trucks working in town, the general location where they are working, and the amount of work completed. Village staff will monitor collection progress and post regular reports on the Village website. Mundelein residents are urged to refrain from waiting until the end of the program to rake their leaves.

Household Chemical Waste Collection Event

Household Chemical Waste (HCW) is a term used to describe a variety of chemical products found in a household that have toxic

or hazardous characteristics. Common HCW products include, but are not limited to, cleaning products, oil based paints/varnishes, flammable liquids, automotive products, garden chemicals, personal care products, and medications. When disposed of improperly (pouring them down the drain, disposing in the garbage) these products can contaminate the groundwater and harm the environment.

The HCW collection program, operated by the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO), diverts HCW from the municipal waste stream by sending it to IEPA approved facilities for safe disposal. **The next HCW collection event in Mundelein will be:**

Saturday, November 1 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. at the Mundelein Metra Station, 205 N. Archer Avenue.

Mundelein Police Explorers Post #184 Win at National Competition

Members of the Mundelein Police Explorer Post #184 recently earned third place for their performance at the 2014 National Law Enforcement Explorer Conference held in Bloomington, IN. The team won in the "Burglary in Progress" event. The Mundelein team was the only team from Illinois to place in any of the team events.

Over 2,000 participants from among 108 Explorer Posts participated in the conference. The conference offered Explorers the opportunity to compete in Team and Individual events to assess their performance in scenario-based events.

The Mundelein Explorer Post #184 is made up of youth between the ages of 14-21, who are interested in a career in law enforcement. Two Mundelein Police Officers serve as Advisors to teach the youth about the profession.

Residents Play Key Role in Keeping Sanitary Sewer Lines Flowing

The Village of Mundelein Wastewater Division works diligently to ensure that residents of the Village can safely use the sanitary sewer lines. However, residents are responsible for their private service lines, that connect to the Village mains.

Residents can take the following steps to help prevent blockages of their lines as well as the public sewers:

- Avoid release of hair into drains of showers, bath tubs, and wash basins to prevent clogs in the traps and drains.
- Clean vents annually (leading from toilets) located on the roof. It is identifiable by a 2 inch pipe on the roof. Failure to clean vents may result in stoppages, causing dangerous sewer line gases to back up into your residence.
- Scrape grease and food residue from dishes and pans into a garbage bag before

placing into your dishwasher or sink. This will reduce grease build-up in the sewer lines.

- Unclog drains naturally by pouring ¼ cup of baking soda down the drain followed by ½ cup of white vinegar. Follow a few minutes later with boiling water. Pour boiling water down the drains weekly to prevent clogs.
- Empty washing machine lint into a garbage bag to avoid the discharge of lint into the sewer line.
- Associations for condominiums or townhome complexes should hire a plumber to conduct preventive maintenance on collector lines in the street. Check all water sources such as sinks, toilets, showers, and outdoor faucets for leaks which can overload the sewer system and increase water and sewer fee costs.

Wise use of the sewage system and performance of simple preventive maintenance will help safeguard the system and reduce costs for everyone.

Save Time! Residents Encouraged to Submit Building Permits Via E-Mail

Simple building permits such as roofing, siding, patios, fences, window and door replacement can be submitted via e-mail. Permits for driveway replacements, sheds, decks and other projects also can be submitted via e-mail as long as the necessary information can be attached to the e-mail. Electronic-e-mail submittals can be sent to building@mundelein.org

In most cases, a Plat of Survey is all that is needed. To find out what information needs to accompany your permit application, please review the information found in the Homeowner's Manual on the Village's website. Use Home Owner's Manual in the search box or it can be found under the Quick Links tab and under "Forms and Maps."

Find Permit Applications on Website

Permit applications can be found on the Village's website at www.mundelein.org. From the tool bar, select "Quick Links" then Forms and Maps and then Building Department for the category and then select minor building permit application from the list. Complete the form and send it along with any other required permit documents via a PDF file to the building Department e-mail address listed above. Once approved, the Building Department will contact you.

Complaints and Concerns

Complaints can also be filed using the same building@mundelein.org if you are having an issue in your neighborhood. Once the e-mail is received, an inspector will be scheduled to look into the complaint the next day.

Fremont Library Participating in “Raising a Reader” Program— First Program of its Kind in Illinois

The Fremont Library has reached an agreement with community volunteers to provide start-up funding to support “Raising a Reader” Lake County, an affiliate branch of the nationally recognized early childhood literacy program. Raising a Reader is a program with over 2,500 community partners (school systems, libraries, community agencies and others) across 32 states. In 2013, the group reached nearly 118,000 children and families, almost 75 percent of whom were living at or below the poverty level, and more than half being English Language Learners.

The Fremont Library will apply grant funds to bring this program to an estimated 120 families in the Mundelein area over the next two school years. “Raising a Reader” Lake County is a program that provides low-income families with high quality children’s literature through a bi-weekly book bag exchange program. Bicultural, bilingual books reflecting families home language and culture are an integral part of this research-proven program that links families to public libraries.

“Raising a Reader” staff also trains parents and care givers in how to

engage children in reading through reading aloud, how to talk about books, and how to make reading a daily habit. Children from low income families often arrive at school without the extensive exposure to books and hundreds of hours of vocabulary development that more advantaged students enjoy. This grant will enable “Raising a Reader” Lake County to pursue pre-kindergarten programs in Mundelein beginning with the bilingual Jump Start classes in D75 this fall.

“We are delighted that Fremont Library has elected to help us extend ‘Raising a Reader’ to eligible families in Lake County. We know that supporting a love of reading is quite possibly the most important way to provide children with the tools to close achievement gaps and grasp their best possible future. We are grateful to Fremont Library for making this new initiative possible,” said RARLC Program Coordinator Doug Lillydahl.

Doug Lillydahl is the Department Chair of the English Department at Stevenson High School. Prior to this role, he was an English teacher at Mundelein High School for 7 years. He and his wife, also a teacher, have started a chapter of “Raising a Reader”, a reading development program for pre-school children, in Mundelein. They are cooperating with Fremont School and the Fremont Library. This is the first Raising a Reader program in Illinois.

New Sewer Back-Up Prevention Program Announced

In an effort to better serve our residents struggling with sanitary and/or sewer backups, the Village of Mundelein is pleased to announce a new Sewer Backup Prevention Program recently approved by the Village Board of Trustees. This program allows eligible homeowners the ability to receive a rebate for improvements they make to their homes to help prevent sanitary and storm sewer problems.

Under this new program, the installation of items such as back water valves, overhead sewers, battery back-up sump pump systems or other related equipment and installations are

eligible for up to a 50% rebate and a maximum of \$4,000.

Residents who are planning to install a battery back-up sump pump, or other items that will aid in preventing sewer back-ups, the Village encourages participation in this rebate program. The Village Board established this program with Mundelein residents in mind with the ultimate goal to help ease the financial burden associated with these types of home improvements.
