Mayor Lentz Appoints Veteran Planning and Zoning Chair to Vacant Trustee Seat

At the May 24, 2017 Village Board Meeting, the Mundelein Board of Trustees approved the nomination of Scott Black to fill the Board vacancy. Mayor Steve Lentz nominated Black for this position based on his years of service to the Village and his first-hand knowledge of Mundelein's vision for the future. Mayor Lentz also considered Black's volunteer history in the community.

"Scott Black brings to the board 21 years of experience on the Planning and Zoning Commission, including 10 years of service as its chairman. That, along with his forward-thinking vision for Mundelein, makes me confident he will serve our Village well," Mayor Lentz said.

"Mr. Black has an impressive and practical amount of experience that he brings to the Board of Trustees on day one, since he has served on the Village's Plan and Zoning Commission for 21 years, 10 of those as chairman," Mayor Lentz added.

To fill the vacant Trustee seat, Mayor Lentz conducted a transparent selection process. More than fifteen residents expressed their interest to serve their community. "I was very pleased with the number of applicants, many of whom had both village and community volunteer involvement and I thoroughly enjoyed each of the nine interviews," he said.

As a new member of the Board of Trustees, Black hopes to continue Mundelein's momentum in the realm of redevelopment. "My hope is that we're able to be witnesses to a vibrant downtown redevelopment, with new housing, shops, and restaurants, and that Mundelein residents will believe in the potential of our town," Black said.

Asked what he is most proud of in terms of Mundelein's growth over the past decade, Black focused on the collective vision that has been carefully cultivated. "We're on the very cusp of exciting changes that will define what Mundelein will look like 5, 10, and 20 years from now. This Trustee appointment is the next step in my ongoing journey in community service, and I am very grateful for the opportunity to serve the residents of Mundelein. It's a great honor and I look forward to working hard on their behalf to help fully realize Mundelein's true potential."

Black continued, "I believe my experience on the Planning and Zoning Commission has prepared me well for the role of Trustee by virtue of a solid understanding of the pace and process of development and an overall good working knowledge of municipal government. I feel my strongest attributes are my abilities to communicate and collaborate, as well as a penchant for being open to the thoughts and ideas of others. I'm a good listener."

Mayor Lentz appointed Mr. Black to the vacant Trustee seat until the term for that seat ends in May, 2019. If Mr. Black wishes to continue to serve as Trustee, he will need to file papers for reelection in December, 2018 and the election for the next term will take place on April, 2019.

Sysmex America, Inc. Completes \$24 Million Expansion of Mundelein Reagents Manufacturing Facility

Sysmex America, Inc. (SAI), a leading provider of automated hematology and urinalysis diagnostic testing equipment, and middleware information systems technology, recently held a formal dedication ceremony for its expanded and newly-modernized reagent manufacturing facility in Mundelein. The Mundelein facility currently employs 64 full-time and contract staff.

"Sysmex America has exhibited double-digit growth in recent years. The expansion and modernization of the Sysmex Reagents America (SRA) manufacturing plant is a \$24 million investment in the long-term growth of this region. Building upon the innovation of our analyzers, we look forward to SAI's continued success," said Mr. Hisashi Letsugu, chairman and CEO of Sysmex Corporation.

"We are very proud that Sysmex America, Inc. management opted to expand their business. We appreciate their significant investment and the trust the company has placed in our community. Mundelein is growing and evolving in all facets of development and this \$24 million expansion is reflective of our broader vision," said Mayor Steve Lentz.

"SAI is also celebrating the recent launch of a number of new hematology analyzers on the market which may generate immediate need for increased reagents. The SRA reagent facility will help us to continue to supply our customers in the U.S., Canada and parts of Latin America through the next decade with the high-level of products and service that they have come to expect from us," said Ralph Taylor, CEO of SAI.

The SRA expansion, under construction since the ground breaking in July 2015, almost doubles the square footage and increases production capacity by nearly 80 percent. The factory represents Sysmex's first initiative to incorporate IoT technology in the manufacturing environment by linking a manufacturing execution system (MES*)—a type of production management system—with manufacturing equipment.

Public Works and Engineering Completes New Bike and Pedestrian Path

Mundelein's Public Works and Engineering Department, in partnership with District 75 and the Mundelein Park and Recreation District, recently completed a 1,300 foot bike and pedestrian path over the Route 53 ROW to allow Mechanics Grove students the opportunity to walk or bike to school instead of taking the bus.

This new path provides pedestrian access from the Longmeadow Estates subdivision to the Mechanics Grove School. The Village's partnership with District 75 was exercised throughout this project. Mundelein PW & E staff worked extensively through the design and construction process with District 75 to ensure the path met their needs. This new path now provides the ability to reduce costs on busing for the district.

The path also serves other purposes. It does provide Longmeadow Estates children a path to walk to school instead of being bused. It also provides a path for Hampton Reserve Subdivision children a walking path to Mechanics Grove Elementary School. The new bike path now connects multiple residential neighborhoods to the school, library, Community Park, Barefoot Bay, and the multi-use path on Midlothian Road connects pedestrians and cyclists to the fair grounds at Petersen Road and other points of interest along the path.

The project started with tree and brush removal on July 24, 2017 and the paving was completed on August 13, 2017. The Village received permission to cross State Route 53 from IDOT, and both District 75 and the Mundelein Park & Recreation District participated in the project by permitting the path to be built on their respective properties.



Mundelein Named a Regional Transportation Authorities (RTA) Success Story

The Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) Chicago recently released its 2016 RTA Community Planning Program Implementation Report. In this report, the Village of Mundelein was featured as an Transit Oriented Development (TOD) Success Story.

The RTA's Community Planning program has assisted municipalities and agencies throughout the Chicago region to plan in coordination with the local transit systems. Over the past few years, the RTA has been conducting routine follow-ups and tracking progress in communities that they provide funding for planning and implementation efforts. The RTA has identified Mundelein as a community that has been implementing the TOD plan created around public transit and Mundelein was given high praise for its strategic steps taken with its Transit Oriented Development.

The report states, "In 2003, the RTA assisted the Village of Mundelein with completing a Station

Area Plan to better assist them in transforming the underutilized area adjacent to the Metra station into a robust Village center. Its recommendations included creating a civic campus near the station, amending Mundelein's zoning ordinance to allow for higher densities as well as improving vehicular and pedestrian access around the commuter rail facility."

The report continues, "Since the completion of the Station Area Plan in 2005, the community's Metra station has observed a growth in ridership. The number of boardings went up by 42% from 2002 to 2014. The percentage of people walking or biking to the commuter rail facility also rose by 8% during the same time period."



Public Works and Engineering Receives Energy Savings Grant



In an effort to be energy conscious, Mundelein Public Works and Engineering collaborated with Midwest Energy Efficiency Alliance (MEEA) to participate in their Savings Through Efficient Products, or STEP, grant program. STEP is funded through the Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity and is one of Illinois Energy Now's programs. The purpose of this program is to provide public facilities with free, high-quality, energy saving products.

As part of this initiative, in November of 2016, an Illinois Energy Now engineer conducted a facility walk-through assessment. The engineer took a product inventory and placed an order for the Village. A total of 46 faucet aerators, 29 indoor LED bulbs, 6 vending misers, 7 shower heads, and 104 outdoor LED bulbs were given to the Village, free of charge. In turn, the Facility Maintenance Division installed these products over the course of a month.

Illinois Energy Now estimates that these improvements will save the Village 49,692 kWh and 760 therms of energy each year, which amounts to \$4,472 in electricity and \$555 in gas savings annually. The estimated lifetime savings incurred from the installation of these products is \$35,564 in electricity and \$5,334 in gas. Through grant programs such as STEP, the Village will continue to reduce its energy consumption.

Board Approves 33 Townhome Development in Mundelein

The Board of Trustees recently approved the development of the remaining balance of 33 townhomes to complete the Lake Ridge Townhomes development located at the corner of Route 45 and Route 60. This development stalled in the midst of the Recession in 2008 but the project is now moving toward completion.

D.R. Horton, Inc., a national developer of residential properties, approached the Village regarding potential acquisition and construction of the remaining balance of the subdivision. The townhome units will be constructed in five additional structures. The new townhomes will have similar, but not identical, architecture and materials to the existing townhomes.

“We are looking forward to completing this beautiful townhome development. This is the last project to get back on track since the recession, so that’s a good sign for the economy. Aesthetically the townhomes will look modern and fresh, but more importantly, the developer, D.R. Horton takes great pride in their work using top-grade materials and adhering to strict building codes,” said Amanda Orenchuk, Community Development Director.

The new townhomes will feature brick on all units, metal roofing on entry porches, limestone elements, bay window projections on key end units, front and rear projections on all units. D.R. Horton is the largest homebuilder by volume in the U.S. for 15 consecutive years. In 2016, the company sold over 600 homes in the communities of Deerfield, Lake Bluff, Arlington Heights, Gurnee, and Elmhurst.




Blackboard Connect Notification System Ensures Quick Communication with Residents

Blackboard Connect enables Village officials to send both urgent and non-urgent notifications. The system provides residents with information/directions in the event of emergency, road closure, or community event. Using Blackboard Connect, officials can record and send an unlimited number of personalized voice messages to home phones, businesses, local agencies and mobile phones in just minutes. The service also sends email, text messages (SMS) to mobile phones and posts on Facebook, RSS feeds and Twitter channels. Messages can also be sent to TTY/TDD devices for people who are hearing impaired.

Maple Hill by K. Hovnanian Homes— 20-Acre Single-Family Subdivision Planned

Recently, K. Hovnanian Homes and Clark Street Development presented a concept plan to the Board of Trustees for the 31-acre parcel located near the southeast corner of IL Route 60/83 and West Maple Avenue.

Clark Street Development, the property owner, will retain the 10 acres north of the creek for future commercial development, which is not proposed at this time. K. Hovnanian Homes proposes 63 single-family homes on the 20 acres area south of the creek. The residential end product would be similar in nature to the nearby Orchard Meadows subdivision.

“Over the years, multiple commercial users have looked at the site and concluded that it would not work economically, largely due to a creek that traverses the property from east to west, the large stock of mature trees, neighbors’ concerns over screening, and the extent of off-site roadway improvements by IDOT. All of these factors have created a situation that causes us to re-evaluate how to best utilize this site,” explains Steve Lentz, Mayor.

“Both Clark Street and K. Hovnanian Homes have a strong pulse on the Mundelein market and on the Chicagoland marketplace. Clark Street Development has previously made every effort to bring commercial development to the

entire site, with limited success. The change in focus to a residential product has brought about a contract with K. Hovnanian Homes. The Maple Hill subdivision will provide rooftops to support Clark Street’s eventual commercial development to the north, as well as other commercial development in the corridor,” explains Amanda Orenchuk, Director of Community Development.

2018 Mundelein Community Days' Dates Set— Mundelein Community Days' Commission Tackles Difficult Scheduling Issue

The Mundelein Community Days' Commission has recommended to the Village Board that the 2018 Community Days festival begin on Thursday, June 28, 2018 at 5 p.m., and wrap-up on Sunday, July 1, 2018 with the fireworks display starting at 9:30 p.m.

In 2018, the Fourth of July holiday falls on a Wednesday. When this occurs, this presents a challenge for scheduling the fireworks display, as this event is the highlight of the festival. In the past, the Village has held the fireworks show separately from the festival, however, the Commission decided against this for next year because our loyal vendors depend on the high attendance the fireworks display draws to make their involvement with the festival profitable. Further, Mundelein's budget for this event is also greatly impacted by not including the fireworks show during the festival.

To address resident concerns about this issue, the Mundelein Community Days' Commission composed a letter to residents that is posted on Mundelein's website. The letter states:

"...The Mundelein Community Days festival takes place over a four-day period and it always includes both weekend days to ensure favorable attendance and to accommodate resident work schedules. It is necessary for the festival to remain a four-day event for several reasons:

- (1) The Community Days festival is completely funded by local business sponsorships, beer tent sales, and through the help of unpaid volunteers. A five-day event would be more costly, leaving the Village to incur these additional costs.*
- (2) The Village depends on numerous unpaid volunteers who dedicate many hours of their time to the festival. Extending the event by an additional day would spread volunteer resources thin.*
- (3) The Village bears the cost of overtime for Police and Public Works staff to assist with the safety and functioning of the event. An additional day would significantly increase overtime costs to the Village.*

For most years, the July Fourth holiday falls on a Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday, or Monday, in which case the fireworks display will remain on Independence Day within the four-day festival. Only during the occasional year, when the Fourth of July falls on a Tuesday or Wednesday, will the fireworks show be moved to another date. After, the 2018 Community Days event, this will only occur two times within the next decade (2023 and 2028). While it is relatively uncommon, we understand that this is an inconvenience to our residents and we have given this issue significant thought. Your understanding is appreciated."

Most recently, Mark worked for the City of Highland Park's Building Department as a Fire Inspector.

Mark earned his Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration. His certifications include: State of Illinois Fire Prevention Officer I, Fire Officer I and II, Fire Cause and Origin Investigator, Fire Apparatus Engineer, Juvenile Fire Setter Intervention Specialist, Technical Rescue, and Hazardous Materials. He is a member of the Illinois Fire Inspectors Association-Fire Investigator's Strike Force, and



the Illinois Professional Firefighter's Association. Mark and his wife Karen reside in Wheeling. They are parents to three children.

Previously, the Fire Inspector position was managed within the Fire Department. Moving this position to the Building Department helps to facilitate better coordination between both departments on building inspections. Also, this reassignment provides the opportunity to cross-train inspectors in both departments.

Mundelein Deputy Fire Marshall Retires after 28 Years of Dedicated Service

After 28 years of dedicated service to the Mundelein Fire Department, Deputy Fire Marshal, Mark Gaunky recently retired. Deputy Gaunky's Walkout Ceremony took place in July.

Deputy Gaunky started his career with Mundelein as a Paid On-Call Firefighter in June, 1989. He went on to work in the Public Works Department in June, 1990. He became a full-time firefighter in November, 1994. He was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant in December, 2007 and was appointed as the Deputy Fire Marshal in March, 2014.

During his tenure with the Mundelein Fire Department, Mark help to rewrite Village's Fire Prevention Codes twice and assisted with the revamping of the Inspector 1 program curriculum for the Office of the State Fire Marshal. Mark also has numerous State certifications for firefighting and fire prevention including: Advanced Fire Prevention Officer, Fire Investigator, Fire Officer II and Fire Instructor II; as well as nationally recognized certifications in fire prevention. He was awarded the NICET II Fire Alarm System Certification from the National Institute for Certification in Engineering Technologies as well as the National Fire Protection Association Certification as a Fire Protection Specialist.

Mark also worked with State officials to have the State of Illinois' Flag Display Act rewritten to include honoring firefighters who died in the line of duty by allowing the Governor to request the lowering of the flags



to half-staff. This was accomplished during the 96th General Assembly and is now Public Act 96-0436.

"Recently, I heard a fire service leader speak at a conference. The speaker, Erron Kinney, made a statement that has stayed with me. He said, 'I want the organization to hurt a little when I leave. If the organization says we miss you, then I have done my job well.' With Mark's departure, the Mundelein Fire Department will indeed hurt a little when he leaves. We are very appreciative of Mark's years of service to the department and for his professionalism throughout his career. He will be missed," said Chief Deputy Fire Chief, Bill Lark.

In his retirement phase of life, Mark plans to take a position with the University of Illinois-Chicago as the Assistant Director of Fire and Life Safety.

Public Works and Engineering Fall Initiatives

ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Construction activity is nearing completion throughout the Village. The Longmeadow Multi-use Path is complete and accessible for children to walk to Mechanic's Grove School. The current phase of the Loch Lomond Infrastructure Modernization Plan is expected to be complete by late October. Thank you for your patience and cooperation during this busy construction season.

WASTEWATER PLANT TOURS

TREE TRIMMING/REMOVAL

Public Works crews will be working with contractors to trim healthy trees and replaced diseased ones from the public parkways. The final replacement trees will be planted for Emerald Ash Borer Management Plan this fall.

TREE PLANTINGS

Fall season brings the second installment of the Village's tree program. This season will include plantings within the Route 45 landscape islands north of Dunbar Road.

Residents Encouraged to Utilize Mundelein's Utility Services Reimbursement Program to help Combat Flooding

The Village of Mundelein's Utility Service Reimbursement Program reimburses eligible homeowners up to 50 percent of the project cost up to a maximum of \$4,000. Installation of overhead sewers, sewer backflow devices, battery back-up sump pump systems and replacement of lead water services are a few examples of what can be eligible for a rebate under this program. Installation of these types of devices and systems can greatly reduce the chance of flooding in your home or basement.

The program is limited to the actual costs of the labor and equipment to install the overhead sewer or backflow device and related equipment or lead water service replacement. The cost for landscape restoration or interior finishes such as painting and carpeting are not eligible under this program.

Lead Water Services

The Village Board recently upgraded the Sewer Back-up Prevention Program to include replacement of lead water services. This program is now called the Utility Service Reimbursement Program. This program can reimburse costs for the installation of equipment, devices, and plumbing alterations which reduce or prevent sewer back-ups into homes and basements for single family and multi-family residential property owners. The enhanced program now includes the replacement of lead water services.

Homes built before 1986 are more likely to have lead pipes, fixtures, and solder containing higher amounts of lead. The Village water pipes do not contain any lead, but some older homes may still have lead pipes connecting the home to the Village water main.

Sanitary Sewer Problems—Best Protocol to Follow to Address Issue

If you experience a sanitary sewer a sewer back-up, Mundelein's Public Works and Engineering Department recommends that the property owner contact Public Works at 847-949-3270 before proceeding with any work. Oftentimes, the staff can determine the best course of action necessary, eliminating costly "guess work." If it is determined that the sewer must be replaced or repaired, the Building Department strongly recommends that the homeowner obtain three estimates from qualified contractors to ensure the best job and most competitive pricing. In many cases, the sewer can be made operable temporarily while proper estimates are gathered, eliminating the pressure of making quick, costly decisions. Fall Leaf Collection Resident Guidelines

The Village's solid waste contractor, Groot Industries, Inc., will be conducting curbside leaf collection. The program typically runs from mid-October through early December. This schedule is dependent upon the weather and how quickly leaves fall from the trees, so timing may vary. Here are a few guidelines to follow to ensure that Mundelein's fall leaf collection proceeds smoothly:

- Please remember to rake leaves to the back of the curb and NOT into the street. Leaves raked into the street may not be collected and can have serious impacts on street sweeping activity in the area, reducing its effectiveness.
- Do NOT mix limbs, brush, stone or other debris into the leaf piles.
- Avoid placing leaf piles near storm drains.
- Pile leaves away parked cars or low hanging tree limbs.

Mundelein Public Works and Engineering Employees Excel at Regional Competition

Public Works and Engineering employees recently participated in the American Public Works Association (APWA) Rodeo competition this May. Public Works employees from local government agencies all over the region participated in this specialized competition. There were two Rodeo competitions: loader and snowplow. The competitions test knowledge through a written exam and a disabled vehicle inspection, which is based on current Illinois CDL driving rules and regulations. Additionally, a field test is administered via an obstacle course to test driving skills.

Two teams from Mundelein Public Works and Engineering competed in the snowplow competition. Adam Streicher and Mike Hassebroek placed 4th and Chris Deremo and Nick Galan

placed 5th out of 40 teams. Long-time Street Division employee Bill Earll placed 8th out of 48 competitors in the loader competition.

"Mundelein employs some of the best equipment operators in the area," said Street Superintendent Craig Schaul, "The Rodeo competition showcases their talent."

Fall is an ideal time for planting new trees. The cooler temperatures reduce the amount of stress on trees typically seen in the summer. As the days grow cooler and shorter, trees require less watering. The soil remains warm even when air temperature cools. All of this allows the trees to establish its roots, better equipping the tree to survive extreme heat and drought in the summer. It is best to have trees planted before November because this gives the tree time to establish its roots prior to the ground freezing.
